IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER

Monitoring Requirements Not Met for South Sangamon Water Commission

On 02/11/2014 we became aware that our system recently failed to collect the correct number of drinking water samples. Although this incident was not an emergency, as our customers, you have a right to know what happened and what we did to correct this situation.

We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not our drinking water meets health standards. During 1/1/2014-1/31/2014 we did not complete all monitoring or testing for coliform and chlorine and therefore cannot be sure of the quality of your drinking water during that time.

We had just began a new water testing schedule at the time and did not correctly schedule testing for said contaminants.

What should I do?

There is nothing you need to do at this time. You may continue to drink the water. If a situation arises where the water is no longer safe to drink, you will be notified within 24 hours.

What is being done?

We began monitoring once every two weeks for coliform and chlorine on 2/11/2014 and will continue to monitor on this schedule.
