Ordinance No. 18-08

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A PREVAILING WAGE FOR THE SOUTH SANGAMON WATER COMMISSION

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois has enacted "An Act Regulating Wages of Laborers, Mechanics, and Other Workers Employed in Any Public Works by the State, County, City or Any Public Body or Any Political Subdivision or by Anyone Under Contract for Public Works", approved June 26, 1941, as amended (820 ILCS §130/0.01, et seq.) (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, the Act requires that the South Sangamon Water Commission investigate and ascertain the prevailing rate of wages as defined in said Act for laborers, mechanics, and other workers in the locality of said South Sangamon Water Commission employed in performing construction of public works, for said South Sangamon Water Commission.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE SOUTH SANGAMON WATER COMMISSION, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: To the extent and as required by the Act, the general prevailing rate of wages in this locality for laborers, mechanics, and other workers engaged in construction of public works coming under the jurisdiction of the South Sangamon Water Commission is hereby ascertained to be the same as the prevailing rate of wages for construction work in Sangamon County as of June, 2018, as determined by the Department of Labor, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by reference. The definition of any terms appearing in this Ordinance which are also used in the Act shall be the same as in the Act.

SECTION 2: Nothing herein contained shall be construed to apply said general prevailing rate of wages as herein ascertained to any work or employment except public works construction of the South Sangamon Water Commission to the extent required by the Act.

SECTION 3: The Clerk of the South Sangamon Water Commission shall publicly post or keep available for inspection by any interested party in the main office of the South Sangamon Water Commission this determination or any revisions of the prevailing rate of wages. A copy of this determination or of any revised determination of prevailing rate of wages then in effect shall be attached to all contract specifications.

SECTION 4: The Clerk of the South Sangamon Water Commission shall mail a copy of this determination to any employer, and to any association of employers and to any person or association of employees who have filed their names and addresses, requesting copies of any determination stating the particular rates and the particular class of workers whose wages will be affected by such rates.

SECTION 5: The Clerk of the South Sangamon Water Commission shall promptly file a certified copy of this Ordinance with the Department of Labor, State of Illinois.

SECTION 6: The Clerk of the South Sangamon Water Commission shall cause to be published in a newspaper of general circulation within the area a notice in the form of Exhibit "b" hereto that this determination of this public body is effective.


